PARTS OF SPEECH

Noun

A noun names a person, place
thing or idea.

Example

Person: Maria, boy, doctor

Place: New York, park, outer space

Thing: Pen, watermelon, table

Idea: Fairness, friendship, fear

PARTS OF SPEECH

Pronoun

A pronoun replaces the name of a person, place, object or idea in a sentence.

Example

you	he	him	those
we	she	her	these
they	me	this	each
	it	that	

PARTS OF SPEECH

Adjective

An adjective describes a noun or pronoun.

Example

Size/Shape: tiny, long, oval

Texture: prickly, smooth, leathery

Odor/Taste: nutty, flowery, sour

Appearance: bright, beautiful, faded

PARTS OF SPEECH

Adverb

An adverb tells how, how often, when or where. It can describe a verb, an adjective or another adverb.

Example

How: loudly, quickly

How often: always, never

When: before, soon

Where: away, inside

PARTS OF SPEECH

Preposition

A preposition shows the relationship (such as direction, time or placement) between a noun or pronoun and another word in a sentence.

Example

about

around

into

across

before

through

after

between

to

PARTS OF SPEECH

Conjunction

A conjunction joins two ideas or shows the relationship between two parts of a sentence.

Example

and

so

until

because

though

while

but

or

unless

PARTS OF SPEECH

Interjection

An interjection expresses strong emotion and is often followed by an exclamation point.

Example

Aw

Hurry up!

Hey

Bravo

Oh no!

Well

PARTS OF SPEECH

Article

An article comes before a noun in a sentence and sometimes shows if the noun refers to a specific or general person, place or object.

Example

General:

a dog
a farm
an apple
an octopus

Specific:

the dog
the farm
the apple
the octopus
